Application-Admission Process

- Applicants must be at least seventeen (17) years of age by the time of enrollment
- Applications will be accepted anytime during the academic year.
- Complete CPM Prospective Student Application
- Complete CPM Application for Enrollment
- Submit a copy of your high school diploma, GED certificate or transcript
- Submit a \$25.00 non-refundable application fee (check or money order)
- Submit an official transcript request form for each educational institution attended or for which you previously earned an academic credit

EDUCATIONAL PROCEDURES

- Once accepted, you will receive an acceptance letter via email and/or regular mail.
- CPM offers a pay as you go plan. Each course is \$125.00. You may also elect to pay three, six months or 1 year in advance. The fee for three (3) months is \$375.00, six (6) months is \$750.00 and the fee for the (1) year is \$1,500.00.
- Each course is up to 40 days in duration with new courses offered every four weeks.
- You will have the option to take courses consecutively throughout the year as scheduled or may elect to "opt out" of a course based on challenges in finances or personal schedule.
- You may make up a "missed course" at any time and as they appear on the schedule. Required courses are generally offered once a year. This educational format allows you to take courses in succession completing an entire program in 10-12 months or achieve your educational goal over a longer period of time based on your schedule.
- All students must complete the required ten (10) core course within the first 60 hours of study. Program 1 contains eight (8) bible and theology core courses and program 2 contains two (2) bible and theology core courses.
- CPM offers the following degrees, bible certificate, associate, masters, and doctorate degrees in the following majors: Bible and Theology, Pastoral Ministry, Divinity, Christian Counseling, Christian Education.
- Students, undergraduate or graduate study may take classes in their declared major or upper level elective once they have completed the ten (10) core courses.

COURSE SYLLABUS

A course syllabus will be issued for each class at the time of registration. The syllabus will provide course objectives, course requirements and all pertinant requirements for the class.

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

All curriculums are designed to give a strong foundation and knowledge of God's Word.

GRADING

All exams, papers, etc., will be graded by the respective instructor. Grades shall be given on an A-F grading scale.

LATE WORK

All course work is due as required on the Course Syllabus. Only those students with an approved excused absence will be allowed to make up work.

PROGRAMS

Undergraduate Degree Programs

CPM Bible College offers fully accredited ministry degree programs designed to empower students for effective ministry according to Ephesians 4:11-12:

And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ (NKJ).

Our programs place strong emphasis on building a personal life of faith in order to inspire others to a life of faith. Each program level will awaken vision and spiritual insight towards the individual calling and destiny God has prepared for each student.

Diploma of Bible and Theology Program One Prerequisite: High School Diploma or GED

This 30 credit program lays a foundation in Bible and Theology, builds Godly character and establishes a strong personal relationship with God. It builds confidence in every student, from the new believer to the seasoned minister. Program 1 applies to ministers, teachers, youth leaders, lay leaders and all Christian workers. The Diploma of Bible and Theology is awarded upon completion of Program one (30 credits).

Core Courses required. Old Testament Survey I, II; New Testament Survey I, II; Knowing God; Doctrine of the Holy Spirit I; Life of Christ I, II.

Associate of Theology

Program Two Prerequisite:

Successful completion of Program One (30 credits)

Program Two continues to build a strong theological foundation. Studies focus on history and Theology. Students continue to gain further knowledge, understanding and application of the Scriptures.

At this level students are encouraged to get involved in their local church and begin to activate what they have learned both in their personal life as well as in a ministry environment. The Associate of Bible and Theology is awarded upon completion of Programs one and two (60 credits).

Core Courses required. Church History I; Doctrine of the Holy Spirit II.

Advanced Diploma in Theology Program Three Prerequisite:

Successful completion of Programs One and Two (60 credits)

Program three is the beginning of the selected major and electives designed to lead students into greater levels of ministerial excellence. Courses at this level are specifically designed to strengthen the student's personal relationship with God and to prepare students vocationally toward their ministry calling with an emphasis on the leading of the Holy Spirit in their life and ministry. To receive an Advanced Diploma from CPM BIBLE COLLEGE, students must have completed 60 hours in Bible and Theology (including "Ten Core Courses") (30 credits)

Bachelor Program

Program Four Prerequisite:

Successful completion of Programs One, Two and Three (90 credits)

The Bachelor Program offers a continuation of courses in the major with accompanying electives. To receive a Bachelor of Ministry degree from CPM BIBLE COLLEGE, students must have completed 60 hours in Bible and Theology (including "Ten Core Courses"), 30 hours in the major and 30 hours of elective study. This includes all transfer of credits up to 60 hours from an approved college or university and CPM BIBLE COLLEGE approved ministerial experience credit.

CPM BIBLE COLLEGE Offers the Following Bachelor Degrees:

Bachelor of Bible and Theology

This is a general program with the widest application to ministry. The Bachelor of Bible and Theology degree applies to all ministry calls; teachers, pastors, evangelists and all those who plan on teaching and preaching the Word of God.

Bachelor of Pastoral Ministry

The Bachelor of Ministry degree includes a strong foundation in Theology with special emphasis on leadership, pastoral dynamics and practical ministry application. This program develops leadership ability and enhances ministry skills for expanding vision and faith.

Bachelor of Christian Counseling

The Bachelor of Christian Counseling degree is a pastoral counseling program designed to be used within the framework of Christian service. It prepares students to meet the emotional, spiritual and psychological needs of all age groups and addresses a wide range of contemporary difficulties normally encountered in the local church and Christian ministry. This degree is offered in cooperation with the American Association of Christian Counselors (AACC).

Per State of Louisiana, Department of Education statute: CPM BIBLE COLLEGE does not guarantee the acceptance of transfer credits to other institutions except those accredited through Accreditation Commission International. Transfer of credits from CPM BIBLE COLLEGE to other institutions of higher learning is accepted solely at the discretion of the institution to which a student is applying.

CPM Bible College, Family Empowerment & Training Institute, like all other establishments of higher learning, impose certain course requirements for all students who are seeking to earn a degree in a specific area of study usually referred to as the student's major. At the present time, CPM BIBLE COLLEGE offers degrees in the following majors; 1) Bible and Theology 2) Pastoral Leadership 3 Divinity 4) Christian Counseling 5.) Christian Education. Other programs may be added from time to time based on need. Additional majors may be available for the Graduate Program depending on a students ministry call. For more information contact the Admissions Office.

CPM BIBLE COLLEGE Course Requirements Are Two-Fold:

1. Core Course Requirement:

Students seeking a Diploma in Bible and Theology are required to complete Program 1. Program 1 contains eight "Core Courses" in Bible and Theology and totals 30 credit hours of study. Students seeking a degree beyond the diploma will be required to complete Programs 1 and 2. Program 2 contains two additional "Core Courses" in Bible and Theology and totals another 30 credit hours of study. The "Ten Core Courses" are required to receive <u>any degree</u> from CPM BIBLE COLLEGE. The "Ten Core Courses" are:

Knowing God
Old Testament I & II
New Testament I & II
Life of Christ I & II

Doctrine of the Holy Spirit I & II Church History I

2. Degree Major Requirements:

After a student has completed 60 hours of study in Bible and Theology a concentration of study will be selected, if the student has not already done so. This is referred to as the student's "major." To earn a Bachelors degree, the student must complete 30 hours in a major and 30 hours of electives, in addition to the required 60 hours of Bible and Theology that contains the "Core Courses".

Each Program (or track of courses) is carefully developed by the Academic Committee to ensure students will meet their degree major requirements for that specific program. When a student stays within the defined Program (regardless of possible course changes made by the Academic Committee) they will automatically achieve their desired degree goal upon completion of each Program. From time to time it is necessary to make a course change mid-year. In such cases, be assured the replacement course will satisfy the requirement.

Examples:

Student 1: Student enrolls at CPM BIBLE COLLEGE with a High School Diploma or GED: Start in Program 1, when all courses in Program 1 are completed including the eight "Core Courses", move into Program 2. When all courses in Program 2 are completed, including the final two "Core Courses", the student will have satisfied requirements for an Associates Degree in Bible and Theology. At that time, a meeting with the Academic Dean is required to determine a major and plan the remainder of the student's program.

Student 2: Student enrolls at CPM BIBLE COLLEGE with prior college in a field other than theology: Start in Program 1. When all courses in Program 1 are completed, including eight "Core Courses", move into Program 2. Once the student has completed Program 2, including the final two "Core Courses", and has a minimum of 60 credits accumulated (including transfer credits added to CPM BIBLE COLLEGE credits), the student will contact the Academic Dean's Office to chart the remainder of a program of study in line with their degree goals. If a major has not been declared, the student will do so at this time.

<u>Please note</u>: all student assessments for college credit transfers are done on a case-by-case basis. Assessments are performed only after the official transcript is received directly from the student's prior college or university. Once the Assessment Committee has completed their assessment students are notified by letter.

CPM Bible College, Family Empowerment & Training Institute offers qualified individuals opportunity for in-depth study in a specialized area of ministry through our Master's and Doctoral Programs. These accredited programs offer practical application in the field as well as academic achievement.

Master's Program

This 45 credit hour ministerial program is designed to prepare the student for a greater degree of ministerial excellence vocationally. Students specialize in an area of study directly related to their ministerial call. In addition to coursework and a thesis, graduate students will fulfill an internship corresponding to their field of study.

CPM Bible College, Family Empowerment & Training Institute offers Master Degrees in:

- Bible and Theology
- Pastoral Ministry
- Christian Counseling
- Divinity
- Christian Education

Upon declaration of a specific program major, the Dean of Graduate Students conducts an orientation with the Graduate degree candidate and also customizes a program of study that adheres to the student's vocational goals in ministry.

Prerequisite: A Bachelor Degree with a minimum of 60 hours in Bible and Theology from an approved college or university.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

MASTER OF BIBLE AND THEOLOGY

The Master of Bible and Theology degree offers the student an opportunity for in-depth Bible and Theological study. Complimenting our Undergraduate Program, the Master's of Bible and Theology provides the student with ministry application opportunities in the field through an internship practicum.

MASTER OF PASTORAL MINISTRY

The Master of Pastoral Ministry is a well-rounded, in-ministry program for pastors, counselors and other full-time ministers. This program places an emphasis on leadership skills, pastoral counseling and theology. It builds on ministry experience while challenging the individual student to pursue and realize their full potential as a leader.

MASTER OF CHRISTIAN COUNSELING

This Biblically based program is designed for those involved in pastoral counseling within the framework of Christian service. It will enable the student to meet the emotional, spiritual and psychological needs of all age groups. The program prepares the student for a wide range of contemporary challenges encountered in the local church and Christian ministry. This degree is offered in cooperation with the American Association of Christian Counselors (AACC). (The CPM BIBLE COLLEGE Counseling Program is not recognized by the State of Louisiana for the purpose of professional licensing.)

SAMPLE MASTER'S PROGRAM:

There are three (3) components of study in each Master's Program.

1. COURSEWORK: (thirty (30) credits)

Each program consists of 10 courses in the student's major consisting of 3 credits each.

2. THESIS: (six (6) credits)

The Master's student is required to write a 75-page thesis on a topic relating to his/her major. Thesis topics are selected by the student in conjunction with the Dean of Graduate Students to insure eligibility to the program.

3. INTERNSHIP: (nine (9) credits)

An integral part of the Master's Program is the internship requirement which gives students opportunity for real-world ministry. The internship is directly related to the student's major and is designed in conjunction with the Dean of Graduate Students to ensure eligibility to the program.

Doctoral Program

The Doctoral degree is a terminal degree representing the highest level of academic achievement possible. CPM BIBLE COLLEGE offers a 44 credit hour Doctoral Program to prepare candidates for the greatest level of ministerial excellence. Students specialize in an area of study directly related to their ministerial call. In addition to coursework, research and a dissertation, doctoral candidates also fulfill an internship corresponding to their field of study.

CPM Bible College, Family Empowerment & Training Institute offers Doctoral degrees in Theology and Ministry. Custom programs in other areas of study will be considered by the Academic Committee as deemed necessary to an individual's ministry call. Upon declaration of a specific program major, the Dean of Graduate Students conducts an orientation with the Post-Graduate degree candidate and also customizes a program of study that adheres to the student's vocational goals in ministry.

Prerequisite: A Master's Degree in a Theological Major from an approved college or university .

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

DOCTOR OF THEOLOGY

The Doctor of Theology degree has the widest application for ministry preparation. This program is applicable for teachers, evangelists, pastors, ministers and other church leaders with a specific call to preach and teach the Word of God. Subjects include areas related to the study of how God relates to man through the Scripture.

DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

The Doctor of Ministry program is a well-rounded, in-ministry program for pastors and other full-time ministers. This program places an emphasis on leadership skills, pastoral counseling and theology. It builds on ministry experience while challenging the individual student to pursue and realize their full potential as a leader.

Sample Doctoral Program:

There are three (3) components of study in each Doctoral Program.

1. Coursework: (twenty-one (21) credits)

Each program consists of 7 courses in the student's major consisting of 3 credits each.

2. Dissertation: (fourteen (14) credits)

The doctoral candidate will write a 175 page dissertation in a topic relating to his/her field of study. Dissertation topics are selected by the student in conjunction with the Dean of Graduate Students to insure eligibility to the program.

3. Internship: (nine (9) credits)

An integral part of the Doctoral Program is the internship requirement which gives candidates opportunity for real-life research and ministry. The internship is directly related to the candidate's field of study and is designed in conjunction with the Dean of Graduate Students to insure eligibility to the program

THEOLOGY

Knowing God

The starting place in any ministry endeavor is to have a strong and intimate relationship with God. This course is brings the learner to a new level of understanding regarding who God is and what His desire is relationally with His people. Included in this class is a detailed examination of absolute and moral attributes of God.

Christology

Through a systematic study of the life of Jesus, Christology examines the person of Jesus as the "author and finisher of our faith". This study is paramount in developing an effective ministry that contains a vibrant faith. The impact of the redemptive work of Christ as it relates to the building of the Kingdom of God is thoroughly covered is this course.

Covenant Theology

To acquire an understanding and greater knowledge of the Blood Covenant in human history. To understand the Abrahamic Covenant as a covenant of promise. To realize that God is the originator of the blood covenant.

Grace

This course is designed to assist in coming to an understanding of God's greatest gift, the gift of grace, and to be enabled to operate more fully from the reservoir of God's operational power in your life and ministry. This class will teach you what it means to receive grace, how grace is seen, and how not to frustrate the grace of God in your life.

Principles of Faith

This course is designed to explain the concept of faith in God and His Word. Emphasis is placed on defining what faith is, how to receive and increase one's faith, and how to release one's faith in their daily life and ministry.

Principles of Prayer

This course is designed to examine the scriptures on the principles of prayer and to help the students prepare to pray with greater confidence and effectiveness. The New Testament reveals that much power is made available through the effective and fervent prayer of the saints. This class will give you the guidelines to experience this power.

Praise Life

This course is created to equip believers to the power, patterns, principles, and practices of praise and worship. You will also experience a pilgrimage in worship leading us into the throne room of God.

Christ the Healer

This course is designed to provide the student with a biblical study of divine healing. God's will to heal all today is evident throughout Genesis to Revelation, as well as the various methods and means to receive healing. This class will bring about a firm establishment in this truth and prepare you to minister healing to others.

Life & Teaching of Christ I

A thorough study of the divinity and life of Christ and His earthly ministry as recorded in the four Gospels. This course also includes a historical survey of the Intertestamental Period. The political and socio-economic parameters that influenced His ministry are examined as well.

Life & Teaching of Christ II

As a continuation of The Life & Teachings of Christ I, part II addresses the last week of Jesus earthly ministry. This course examines in detail the great message of liberation that the atoning work of Christ provides.

Doctrine of the Holy Spirit I

A thorough study of the Pentecostal doctrine of the Holy Spirit giving attention to the person and work of the Holy Spirit. This course focuses on knowing and experiencing the Holy Spirit's presence and empowerment in the Christian life.

Discipleship I

We must guide new converts to a place of stability in their relationship with God and their Kingdom involvement. This course presents the philosophy, approach, and tools that will assist the student in leading others to maturity.

Writing For Success

This course is specifically designed to enhance student's skills in the English language usage, writing in preparation for writing demands of their role in ministry and writing research papers throughout their course of study at CPM BIBLE COLLEGE.

Church History I and II

These courses are designed to teach the student the origin of the Christian church, its birth and development from the Day of Pentecost to modern times. They give the opportunity to learn the lessons of history in order to create our own godly heritage and legacy.

Dynamics of Faith

To examine the various Scriptural dynamics that acts upon our faith. How these Godly spiritual forces serve to initiate, strengthen and under gird our faith, bringing us to victory in receiving the promises of God.

Understanding Righteousness

This course is designed to present a clear understanding of what righteousness is, the need for it and how it is obtained through biblical principles. As an integral part of our Redemption, righteousness is not only the position of the believer, but a powerful force operating within the Kingdom of God. This class supplies the ability to wield the force of righteousness.

Ministry Gifts

This course is designed to teach the student the function and characteristics of the five-fold ministry. The Word of God teaches these five-fold callings carry with them their own anointing and gifts. This class assists in locating one's own calling as well as supplying an appreciation for these gifts.

Spiritual Gifts

This course is designed to give the student a working knowledge of the nine gifts of the Spirit as described in 1 Corinthians 12 & 14. Each gift will be described and understood through biblical and present day examples. This class will place you in a position of availability and openness to the moving of the Spirit.

Hermeneutics

We are told in the scriptures that we are to rightly divide the word of God. In this class students learn how to interpret the scriptures accurately. Principles are given that will keep the Bible student in truth and out of error. This course is imperative for all those who plan on preaching God's word.

Biblical Finances

This course is designed to provide a study of God's plan of provision and abundance for His people. The Word of God repeatedly speaks of the blessing of the Lord for His people and their obligations for financial stewardship. This class will serve to position you to receive and to faithfully manage God's abundant supply.

The Anointing

This course is designed to teach the students to identify the anointing of God in the Old Testament & the New Testament. The anointing of God is the supernatural equipment provided by God to get the job done. This class positions you to receive His anointing as well as the ability to release that anointing to others.

Ministering By The Holy Spirit

This course explores the gifts and ministry of the Holy Spirit as it relates to one's personal call to ministry. Mature Christians with a well-defined ministry, or those in the developmental stages, will become more fruitful by understanding the dynamics of a Spirit-led ministry. This class discovers the Biblical pattern of God's call to His servant as it relates to every aspect of ministry.

Ministry of Helps

This course is designed to help the student understand the value of serving in the Body of Christ. Jesus Himself came to serve, not to be served and has instructed us to follow His example. No matter what your place in the Body of Christ is, this class will strengthen your service and develop Christ likeness within you.

Patterns for Revival

By exploring the patterns of history that led to the great moves of God, we can learn how to position ourselves in the Body of Christ today to experience the outpouring of the Holy Spirit others have encountered in times past. This course outlines in detail the godly principles that usher in revival among God's people.

The Trichotomy

This course is designed to learn to differentiate between spirit, soul and body. With a firm biblical understanding of the tri-part composition of man, you are poised for greater spiritual growth and development. This class will also prepare you to accurately ascertain and minister to the needs of people.

History of the Bible

This course is designed to give understanding of the basic facts about the origin of the Bible essential for every Christian. Inspiration, the biblical canon, major manuscripts, textual criticism, early translations, and modern versions are some of the major topics that will be discussed. This class will deposit a greater respect and appreciation for the Bible.

Conformed to His Image

This course is to help and to equip each one to walk in maturity and purity in their ministry calling until they reach their destined purpose. This class will prepare you to fulfill your destiny and get the maximum benefits along the way.

Introduction to Greek

This course is to introduce the student to the original language of the New Testament. Upon completion of the course, the student will have a working knowledge of Greek grammar, vocabulary, and some of the more common tools used for Greek exegesis, along with word studies to more accurately interpret a Bible text.

Israel and Bible Prophecy

This course studies the amazing place Israel has in the last days. What do current events in Jerusalem tell us about the end times? Jerusalem has a rich, fascinating history spanning more than 3,000 years. But the city's most significant days are still to come. The stage is now being set for both a terrifying destruction and an amazing deliverance...far beyond what anyone could ever imagine!

Angelology

This course is designed to teach the student about the origin, activity and ultimate destiny of the two great hosts of angelic beings, angels and demons. This class will provide a biblical understanding of the angelic realm, their realm of influence and authority, and our dealings with them.

Spiritual Warfare

This course is designed to give a biblical understanding of the demonic realm, its structure and operations, and the authority believers have over it. This class will give you a proper biblical perspective of the power of the enemy, his defeat at Calvary, and how to exercise our delegated authority over him.

Eschatology I

This course offers an in-depth study of the book of Daniel as it pertains to historical and prophetic content. Through this exciting course, the student will gain an appreciation for the providential power and sovereignty of God. Eschatology I provides the prophetic glimpse into the unfolding plan of God for His people.

Eschatology II

As a continuation of Eschatology I, part II explores the prophetic literature penned by John in the Book of Revelation. Through a focused study of the Book of Revelation; with its figurative language and apocalyptic events, students taking this course will explore the dimension of who Jesus is and His ministry towards man. God's divine plan for the end of the Church Age is juxtaposed with the rampage of satan, as the unparalleled events of human history are about to climax.

Revelation

This course is designed to give you a greater revelation of the Lord Jesus Christ. Through a proper study of the Book of Revelation, with its figurative language and apocalyptic events, a further dimension of who Jesus is and His ministry towards man is revealed. This class focuses on God's divine plan for the end of the age as opposed to the final rampages of the enemy.

BIBLE

Old Testament Survey I

Providing an overview of The Old Testament from Genesis to II Kings, this course gives the student a solid overview of the Old Testament. The perusal through each book presents the author, message, theme and spiritual emphasis revealing the intertwining thread of redemption to mankind.

Old Testament Survey II

This course is a continuation of Part I. The splitting of the Kingdom ushered in a new methodology of God's interaction with His people, that of the prophetic message. The power of a covenant keeping God provides the platform from which this study blossoms.

New Testament Survey I

This course is an historical and thematic survey of the contents of the four Gospels and the Book of Acts. Particular attention is given to the cultural, historical and geographical settings for the preparation, entrance, and ministry of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

New Testament Survey II

This course is a continuation of New Testament I and offers a historical and thematic survey of the contents of the New Testament from Acts to Revelation. Special focus is given to the impact of the message of Kingdom living that the epistles present, not only to the Greco-Roman world but in our day as well.

Acts of the Holy Spirit I

This course is designed to be a study of the ministry of the Holy Spirit in the New Testament Church. The Acts of the Apostles could be more accurately entitled the Acts of the Holy Spirit. From the opening chapter to the final unending story, it is the Spirit that moved upon individuals to perform the miraculous. This class will review those acts for the purpose of learning the ways of the Spirit and how to yield to Him.

Petrine Literature

This course is designed to explore and discuss several of the major themes found in Peter's letters. This class supplies practical applications with understanding concerning; the believer's relationship to God and others, the place of suffering in a believer's life, filtering the error of false teachers with the power of Truth, and the certainty of the Lord's return.

Pauline Literature

This course is designed to study the writings and revelations of Paul to the Church. Within his letters, the Apostle Paul details what is known as The Pauline revelation, which he received directly from the Lord Jesus. The Pauline revelation reveals to us what Jesus accomplished in Redemption, the Church's position in Christ and the work of the Spirit. This class follows these truths throughout his writings.

Johannine Literature

This course is designed to explore the overall content of John's gospel, it's purpose and related teaching. While the other Gospels survey a large variety of events in Jesus' earthly ministry, the Gospel of John zeros in on several key events, personal encounters, and statements in the life of Jesus. This class brings truth to the deity of Jesus and establishes belief in the Son of God.

Daniel

This course is a study in the Book of Daniel. In addition to the historical and prophetic content, this book is a tremendous revelation of the providential power and sovereignty of God.

Ephesians

This course is a study on the major themes of the Book of Ephesians. This powerful epistle develops the believer's responsibilities in maintaining unity, godly conduct, healthy relationships and how to stand firm in spiritual conflicts. Learn to practically apply the wisdom of the Scriptures.

Galatians

This course reviews the cultural background and history of the church at Galatia, its strengths and weakness. Careful analysis of faith versus works is discussed from a doctrinal viewpoint. Special emphasis is given to the spirit-filled life of the Christian with application to our every day lives.

Romans

This course is designed to understand basic truths of salvation and to clarify terms such as: Justification, Sanctification and Grace. The truths in this epistle are the cornerstone for Christian doctrine and belief. This class will lay a solid, doctrinal foundation from which the great truths of the Church are built.

Colossians

This course gives the student an overview of the history and cultural background of the church at Colosse, its strengths and weakness. Special emphasis is given to Christian doctrine found in Colossians and the heresies that were being spread in Colosse at the time of this writing. Application is given to Paul's admonishment to the Colossians as it relates to our present day lives with emphasis on the believer's authority.

Hebrews

This course is designed to study the book of Hebrews with emphasis on the "Superiority of Christ" and His high priestly work. The ministry of Jesus takes on richer depth and clarity as this epistle is taught and understood. This class will provide that in addition to Jesus' present day ministry to believers today.

COUNSELING

Counseling Foundations

This course outlines the fundamental principles of Christian Counseling. Students learn that effective ministry is a combination of natural and supernatural principles. This course covers such topics as; ministering the love of God, the issues of confidentiality, and the ministry of healing the heart and soul of God's people. This course covers the basics of restoration.

Pastoral Counseling Models

This course describes and demonstrates Biblical models for counseling, effective models for crisis interventions and special issues for those experiencing emotional issues of loss or grief. This class will grant you the ability to lovingly care for and minister to some of the greatest needs in a believer's life.

Conflict Management

This course is designed to describe and to demonstrate the five basic styles of conflict and how to deal with it in a positive way. It is vital to every person desiring ministry and

leadership in any capacity. This class will prepare you for the conflicts that inevitably be encountered.

Ethical and Legal Considerations of Counseling

The Christian Counselor must pay close attention to the many issues surrounding the topic of ethics. In this course difficult issues are addressed to prepare the Christian Counselor to minister with wisdom and effectiveness in keeping with the word of God and abiding by the laws of the land.

Christ Centered Memory Counseling

Theophostic is comprised of two words; God and light. This course teaches the pastoral counselor how to bring the light of God into any difficult counseling session. In this class students learn how to allow the Great Counselor, Jesus Christ, to bring healing and revelation into the lives of hurting people.

MISSIOLOGY

History of Missions

This course helps to gain an understanding of how missions work began, tracing it from the early pioneers, their vision, strategies and difficulties and how missions work has changed over the centuries. With this knowledge, you will gain the wisdom and understanding amassed through the years of service of these dedicated servants. This class will serve as an invaluable resource for years to come.

Comparative Religions

This course is designed to present an overview of the world's major religions and non-Christian cults and to make the students aware of their impact on the history and current events of our world. With a basic understanding of these religions and cults, you can more effectively reach the hearts of those trapped in these bondages. This class will give you the resources to achieve such a purpose.

The Holy Spirit and Missions

This course is designed to examine the expansion and growth of the church through the operation and action of the Holy Spirit in the light of His powerful and supernatural manifestations. The Spirit was expressly given to empower the Church to be a witness. This class will give you understanding into the various ways and means that He accomplishes His mission.

Acts: A Global Vision

This course is designed to study the Book of Acts as a manual for worldwide evangelism. By following the pattern that brought in a mighty harvest with the early church, we can experience the same results in our own harvest fields today. This class is a powerful study of the Spirit's work to draw the world to the saving knowledge of Jesus.

PASTORAL MINISTRIES

Communication in Ministry

Effective communication is the heart of every ministry, business and life in general. This course is designed to enhance and enable each student to become a better communicator.

It reviews the communication model, factors that hinder communication and organizational skills to facilitate all facets of communication; both written and oral. This class is invaluable to leaders in the Body of Christ who sole job is to communicate the most powerful message in existence; the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Homiletics I and II

Homiletics I is designed to acquaint the student with practical principles of preaching and teaching. It is through the "foolishness" of preaching that God has chosen to reach the world. This class will give you the framework from which the Holy Spirit can build a word that will transform a life. Homiletics II is a preaching/teaching lab allowing the students to apply what has been learned in Homiletics I.

The Laws Of Leadership I

Based upon Dr. John Maxwell's 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership. This course will transform you as well as your prospective of your ability to lead. This class takes the leader on an informative journey of discovery and strength.

The Laws Of Leadership II

A continuation of the Laws of Leadership I based upon Dr. John Mawell's teaching. When a leader learns and applies these laws, not only will they find fulfillment, but the ones they lead will fulfill the destiny of their own lives. This class provides the leader with the laws that will govern their success in ministry and life.

The Timothy Program I & II

This course examines the principles taught by Paul to his son in the faith and future minister; Timothy. Special emphasis is given to the keys of effective ministry especially towards the aspiring minister. Paul outlines in these epistles powerful truths that every minister should embrace and practice.

Introduction To Christian Education

This course is a study of the basic principles and practices of organizing, administrating, and supervising a balanced program of Christian Education. A thorough exploration of the concepts of Biblical instruction and teaching dynamics is included in the course material. The functions of the Board of Christian Education, the Christian Education Director, and the role of church workers in the education process will be examined as well.

Ministry Preparation I

This course is designed to search the heart of a leader through character development. Do you desire to grow and develop to your potential as a leader in ministry? Do you desire to bring the glory of God and edify the Church? This class will plant those desires within you as well as the practical steps to see them fulfilled. This class will benefit the potential leader or the seasoned veteran in ministry.

Ministry Preparation II

This course continues with preparing the leader and developing the minister. The Biblical pattern of preparation, as well as the examples of great biblical characters, will be fully examined. Days of preparation are never wasted days.
